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1.e4 e5 2.Nc3. In the Vienna Game, rather than the more common 2.Nf3 - attacking the black e-pawn - White chooses to instead concentrate on defense of his own pawn. The could be a prelude to either an aggressive strike with f2-f4, or slower build-ups involving Bc4 or g3 and Bg2. Pros: Less theoretical than the Spanish Game. Avoid Petrov's Defense.
